- ✓ Management staff from local, regional and national energy agencies

- ✓ Improved knowledge of Slovenian Structural & Cohesion Fund availability for public building energy efficiency savings projects.

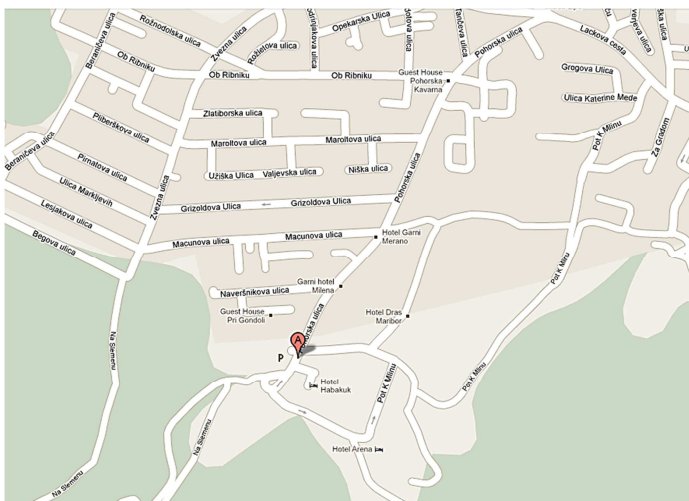
